Commissioner McElroy: My name is Rachel Connell and I am the Director of Membership & Events for North America's SuperCorridor Coalition (NASCO). We at NASCO are a nonprofit organization made up of dues-paying members from the public and private sectors who have been involved in efforts to maximize the efficiency of our existing highway and intermodal and multi-modal infrastructure assets, including existing Interstate Highways 35/29/94 and the many intersecting modes of transportation rail, air and sea that affect its operations.
